Subject Clackamas 800 Radio Group Representation

#### **Actions Requested**

Staff requests the Board of Directors authorize the Board chairman to sign the enclosed letter.

#### **Background**

Sandy Fire District #72 is one of nineteen partners in Clackamas 800 Radio Group (C800). This radio group develops, manages, and operates the 800mHz radio system in Clackamas County. It is governed by its board of directors which is comprised of a representative from each of the nineteen partner agencies. Since July 1, 2023, Clackamas Fire District has been representing Sandy Fire District #72's interests at C800 board meetings.

At C800's October meeting, an attendee asked the question of Sandy Fire District #72's status. Subsequent discussion identified questions on whether the district counts as a separate entity for purposes of meeting quorum requirements and whether it retains voting authority. The discussion led to consensus that the executive committee would review the matter.

On November 6<sup>th</sup>, C800's executive committee held a regular meeting and discussed this an agenda item. Present at the meeting were Lake Oswego Fire Chief Don Johnson, West Linn Police Chief Pat Mahuna, and Clackamas Fire Assistant Chief Brian Stewart, and executive director Mark Buchholz. The discussion reviewed prior and existing service agreements between partners and the difference between service agreements and permanently combining organizations into one entity.

The executive committee confirmed that Sandy Fire District #72 retains all its rights as a partner agency and that Clackamas Fire District has been representing the District since July 1<sup>st</sup>. To ensure clarity with all C-800 partners – including current and future board members – the executive committee is requesting the Sandy Fire District #72 board of directors sign a letter delegating Clackamas Fire District as its representative to the C800 board.

#### **Policy Implications**

The requested letter essentially provides C800 individualized confirmation that Clackamas Fire District has the authority to provide services that are already authorized under the INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN SANDY FIRE DISTRICT #72 AND CLACKAMAS FIRE DISTRICT #1 FOR ALL FIRE PROTECTION AND EMERGENCY SERVICES.

- FMO conducted school inspections for North Clackamas, Sandy, Oregon City, Boring, and Gladstone districts.




# **Notable Events/Calls**


- Nov 3 Technical Rescue on 97th Avenue. Crews rescued an uninjured occupant from a vehicle that went 25 feet over an embankment. The rescue was safely executed in 16 minutes.
- Nov 8 Technical rescue on USFS land, where a single vehicle rolled 100 feet over a steep embankment. One patient was trapped. Crews worked with CCSO Search & Rescue and Estacada Fire to stabilize the vehicle and extricate the patient.
- Nov 16 Crews responded to a commercial fire at 7600 SE Johnson Creek Blvd. The source was fuel that ignited from dismantling an RV frame with a sawzall. The fire was mostly out on arrival and crews worked to clear smoke and assess damage.
- Nov 30 Crews responded to a 12x20 building fire that was two feet from the residence. The unit was under construction. Fire quickly consumed the structure and crews worked to protect the exposure building from any damage.


