Subject Sandy Surplus Apparatus

Action Requested

Staff is requesting Board approval to declare the following identified apparatus as surplus and to allow the Fire Chief to proceed with disposal.

Background

This apparatus was purchased in compliance with purchasing policies in place at the time of acquisition and the District has title to this Rescue. This asset does not fit in with the current deployment models or any forecasted future model and is no longer used or needed by the District. Estimated values were determined by staff utilizing outside apparatus and equipment sales comparisons, however, actual prices will vary based on market conditions at the time of sale.

Board Policy Implications

The Fire District's Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) on Disposal of Equipment requires a description of the equipment, method of purchase, original acquisition cost, and an estimated fair market value.

Budget Implications

Additional revenue may be experienced upon the disposal of this equipment. Methods of disposal may include sale or donation to other public agencies where appropriate as determined by the Fire Chief, advertisement to the general public via sealed bids, or public auction process. This apparatus will be sold as surplus according to District guidelines.

Recommendation

Staff recommends Board approval to declare the identified rolling stock as surplus and to allow the Fire Chief to proceed with disposal in accordance with District Policy.

Extrication Training in Sandy

Highlights

Clackamas Fire transferred two Oregon City antique fire apparatus to the Oregon Fire Service Museum in Brooks for the public to enjoy.

Training

Clackamas Fire hosted a 2-day lecture at Camp Withycombe called Mastering Fireground Command - Calm the Chaos! It was followed by an intensive Train the Trainer 3-day workshop.

Community Resilience participated in a County Hazmat Rail Plan Exercise, Fire Officer I training, active shooter training and response, and instructed an incident command training in ICS 400.

Clackamas Fire instructed members of fire and law enforcement from across the state for the annual swift water rescue training. The training brought together over 40 participants for a week-long course that began in the classroom, followed by four days of work in the frigid water of the Sandy River.

Firefighters from the Sandy Station and East Battalion refined their extrication skills. The drill objectives were vehicle stabilization and patient access, while also reducing extrication times.




Notable Events/Calls


- Clackamas Fire crews were busy responding to the Blue Heron Paper Mill throughout February as flare
 ups and smoke issues arose. The demolition began on the affected structures that will free up space to
 start on the exposure buildings as well. The demolition company, hired by the property owner, is
 equipped with a fire hose running along the base of the building, to extinguish any flare-ups.
 The Blue Heron incident involved (including mutual aid) about 80 dispatched apparatus and 175
 personnel.
- 2/9 Residential Fire in Oregon City South Battalion's B Shift was dispatched to a house with a fully involved fire and parts of the house collapsing. Residents had already evacuated to a neighbor's house. Crews found heavy fire that extended into the attic, living space, and garage. They were able to get a quick knock down of the fire and began extinguishing hot spots and conducting salvage and overhaul.




