FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

HIGHLIGHTS

DECEMBER 2025

- Operation Santa Claus 2025 was a success.
- Payroll has been researching the “No Tax on Overtime” provisions to provide accurate reporting for 2025 W-2s.
- The HVAC replacement project at St. 3 was completed.
- CFD hosted a 2-day Struggle Well workshop that focused on post traumatic growth for firefighters.
- Community Services kept busy teaching in schools.
- CFD partnered with City of Happy Valley to staff the holiday bell ringing for the Salvation Army.
- The District and partner agencies kept busy with the flooding impacts around our communities.
- The Sandy Fire Board of Director's approved Resolution #25-03 proposing annexation of the District into Clackamas Fire effective July 1, 2026, contingent upon voter approval, at the monthly Board meeting.

Notable Events

Dec. 20, 2025 – Landslide in Oregon City: Clackamas Fire responded to reports of a possible landslide developing near Newell Creek Canyon. After an initial assessment, Level 2 (“Get Set”) evacuations were issued for the neighborhood, and a Level 3 (“Go Now”) evacuation was issued for one home. This incident showcased exceptional interagency collaboration: Oregon City Police provided drone support, and we worked closely with PGE, NW Natural, the Clackamas County Emergency Operations Center (EOC), a county building official, Oregon City Public Works, the Red Cross, Clackamas County Human Services, and a private engineering firm retained by the City of Oregon City. With this coordinated effort, the situation quickly stabilized.

Dec. 25, 2025 – Church Fire in Oregon City: Crews were dispatched to a commercial fire at the Reformation Covenant Church. Upon arrival, firefighters located the fire while additional crews conducted a search for victims. The fire was located between an old and new roof, requiring complex and coordinated operations to ventilate and attack the fire from above. Due to the complexity and need for additional resources, it was upgraded to a second alarm. The fire was brought under control around 3:32 pm with no report injuries. A big thanks goes out to Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue who provided mutual aid on this incident.







On November 7, 2025, Clackamas Fire responded to a working house fire on Cherry Ave in Oregon City. As crews arrived on scene, the resident went into cardiac arrest across the street.

Oregon City Police Officers James Kanalz and Ben Griffin immediately stepped in, assessing the patient and beginning CPR without hesitation. They worked shoulder-to-shoulder with our firefighters, continuing lifesaving efforts until the patient regained a pulse and was transported to a local hospital.

On an incident with both a structure fire and a medical emergency, our resources are stretched thin. Officers Kanalz and Griffin's decisive actions, professionalism, and partnership were critical to the outcome and directly led to a life being saved.

Today, at the Clackamas Fire Board of Directors meeting, we proudly recognized their exceptional service, teamwork, and unwavering commitment to the community. We're also grateful to share that the patient was discharged from the hospital just a few days later. Strong work! #dedicatedtosave

- Remaining ready to respond to water rescue calls
- Conducting search and rescue operations in areas still experiencing flooding
- Preparing for another storm system bringing additional rain and wind
- Leading drills and training alongside other deployed teams
- Scouting at-risk areas ahead of potential flooding to identify safe and effective operation strategies
- Assessing impacted areas to support ongoing response and recovery efforts

We continue to wish our team a safe deployment, and our thoughts are with the people of Washington as they navigate the impacts of this flooding.




So sorry this letter is late getting to you after my 90 year old husband's falling incident (Nov. 15th @ 11:30 p.m.). 
